

An Auti-Craft Pattern

**Measurements** 25cm x 25cm (10" x 10")

### Materials

- Approx 40g of 8ply cotton yarn per cloth
- (I used 50g balls of Flinders or BWM cotton)
- Pair of 3.5mm needles





# **Comfy Cotton Cloth One** Cast on 58 stitches Row 1: k2, p2, repeat to end Row 2: p2, k2, repeat to end Row 3: p2, k2, repeat to end Row 4: k2, p2, repeat to end

Repeat rows 1-4 twenty times Repeat row one Cast off loosely in pattern Cut yarn, weave in ends Block to measurements

# Comfy Cotton Cloth Two

Cast on 58 stitches Row 1: k1, \*p2, k1, repeat to end Row 2: p1, \*k2, p1, repeat to end Row 3: knit Row 4: purl Repeat rows 1-4 twenty times Repeat row one Cast off loosely in pattern Cut yarn, weave in ends Block to measurements

# Cast on 57 stitches Row 1: k3, \*p3, k3, repeat to end Row 2: p3, \*k3, p3, repeat to end Row 3: k3, \*p3, k3, repeat to end Row 4: p3, \*k3, p3, repeat to end Row 5: p3, \*k3, p3, repeat to end

**Comfy Cotton Cloth Three** 

Row 6: k3, \*p3, k3, repeat to end Row 7: p3, \*k3, p3, repeat to end Row 8: k3, \*p3, k3, repeat to end Repeat rows 1-8 nine times Repeat rows 1-3 Cast off loosely in pattern Cut yarn, weave in ends Block to measurements

## **BONUS PATTERN - Scrubbies**

If you have used 50g balls of yarn, you will have a small quantity of leftover yarn from each ball, but not enough to make another washcloth.

If you don't want to waste these bits, they make great little makeup removers (scrubbies) to match the washcloths.

Pattern 1: Cast on 22 stitches and work 33 rows of cloth one pattern. Pattern 2: Cast on 22 stitches and work 33 rows of cloth one pattern. Pattern 3: Cast on 21 stitches and work 31 rows of cloth three pattern

Cast off loosely in pattern Cut yarn, weave in ends
